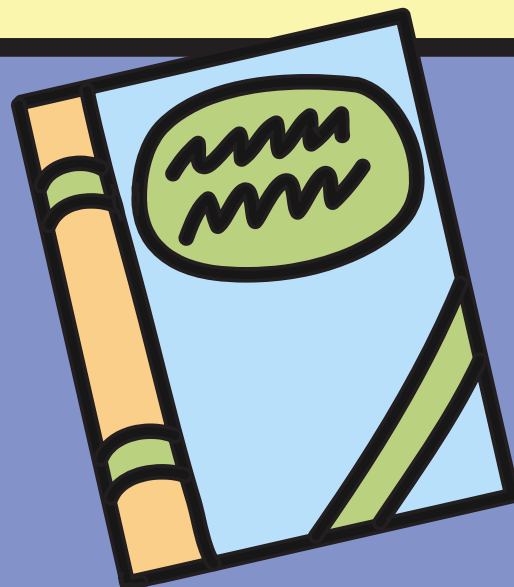

Data has value to teaching when it informs the teacher about what the students are learning and informs the teacher about the next steps. Data has value for student learning when it helps students to understand the progress they have made and when it fits into a continuum of learning that shows the students where to next.

In this session the presenter will explore how he uses the data he has collected in a continuous assessment process to inform his teaching and to support students to set learning goals. The emphasis of the session is on interpreting Excel spreadsheets created by the presenter and participants (see the previous course in this sequence – IEUL19109).
