## NCCD WORKLOADS: THE FACTS

Following consultation with the IEU about the workload implications of the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD), the Department of Education, Skills and Employment has issued an updated 'NCCD Evidence Fact Sheet' for the non-government sector.

The Fact Sheet clarifies common misconceptions about the requirements of the NCCD evidence-collection process. It's vital that teachers and LSOs / aides are aware of these, and that schools ensure that NCCD requirements are met without creating unnecessary additional work for staff.

## THREE TOP TIPS FROM THE FACT SHEET:

Schools are NOT required to create new or additional evidence for the purposes of the NCCD, or to collate the evidence into one document.

Providing that schools keep records of relevant adjustments and timetables, teachers and LSOs / aides are NOT required to create or provide additional notes or annotations post-class.

Duplication of evidence into other forms, different formats or to other locations is NOT required at a class, school or system level.

The IEU will continue to work with members and employers to ensure that the workload implications of the NCCD are minimised.
